

Day Center for homeless women



- Provides safety & support for homeless women
- > 200 women utilization daily
- Current overnight services:
 - Meals
 - Laundry
 - Showers
 - Lockers
 - connections to community resources → housing, employment, & stability

- Minimal grocery stores within walking distance
- ++ construction around the block
- Large homeless population in the area
- Easy access to transportation (buses right outside the door)

- Women at shelter
- Staff
- Literature review

Secondary


Oral screenings in the dental van

- Fillings

2024 King County Statistics

- 16,385 individuals experiencing homelessness in 2024
 - o 5,140 women were experiencing homelessness in 2024 (King County Regional Homelessness Authority, 2024) which is about a 21.5% percent increase from 2022.

Implementation



Weekly Activities

- Played calming music in the background
- Wrote self-empowering affirmations
- o Drew, colored, and created art

Dental Van

- o Developed Dental Van flyer
- Posted sign-up sheet and encouraged women to sign-up
- Waiting room on day of dental van







Evaluation & Outcomes

• Weekly Activities

 The women reported feeling empowered through the use of art therapy and affirmations.

• Dental Van

Twelve people signed up for the service (8 women utilized services)

Limitations

• Wheelchair accessibility

 There were steep stairs leading up to the dental van, making it inaccessible to someone who uses a wheelchair

• Language barriers

- There was limited access to an interpreter for the women who spoke a language other than English.
- Working with a 3rd Party





Recommendations

- Streamlining patient information between the dental van and student group
- Providing information about the population
- Trauma-Informed Care
